#### Food

In January 2025, the average cost of a basic food basket for a family of four was R3,830.05.

#### Electricity

- •The National Energy Regulator of South Africa (NERSA) has approved a 12.74% electricity price hike for Eskom, set to take effect in the next financial year.
- •Electricity and transport take up 57.7% of a worker's wage (R2,802,97/R4,854,08) according to Pietermaritzburg Economic Justice and Dignity (PMBEJD)
- •Food is bought after transport and electricity costs have been paid for or money set aside, leaving R2,051,11 for food and everything else.

### Housing Subsidy



#### R3000 Housing Allowance

•First Home Finance (formerly known as FLISP) is a government subsidy ranging from R38 878 - R169 264, aimed at first-time homebuyers with an income ranging from R3 501 to R22 000 per month.

### MEDICAL AID SUBSIDY

- Medical aid allowance:
  Employer to contribute
  70%, employee 30%
- Labour demands clear timelines with regards to the sourcing of cheap and affording medical aid



#### R60/P.H MLPS BOOK OFF ALLOWANCE

For the past years, this allowance has not been improved and therefore the perpetual increase of living costs and other economic factors necessitated it to be improved.





# R50 P/H TOP UP FOR STAND BY ALLOWANCE.

- The current standby allowance is at R90.00 and It has not been improved for over a long period of time.
- The current allowance be topped up by R50.00 owing to the current economic conditions.

#### 1 YEAR AGREEMENT

- The unemployment rate in South Africa is forecast to 32.79% in 2024.
- The unemployed people in South Africa is forecast to 8.24m in 2024.
- •The employment rate in South Africa is forecasted to 57.04% in 2024. The total labor force in South Africa is forecasted to 25.13m in 2024.
- •Trade unions are obligated to preserve employment, therefore, there should be no retrenchment during the period of this agreement.
